Pray for the Harvest

Update from the Albanian Ministry led by Martin Katro

Some things have changed for those involved with the Albanian ministry in Northeast Philadelphia: Jason Stryd has moved to Boston to work with the large Albanian population of around 80,000, and Martin Katro has been told his corporate position is being eliminated. Through much prayer and seeking, it has been decided that God is moving the family in the direction of focusing solely on ministry rather than being the tent-maker he has been for much of his life.

This will be an opportunity for people to help partner with the ministry in Northeast Philadelphia, which is the very first evangelical church or ministry directed at reaching out to Albanian immigrants. From its beginnings as an ESL program from New Life Glenside fifteen years ago, it grew into a group which explored Christianity in Albanian, and now it has grown into a regular Sunday service for the past 7 years with 30-40 Albanians in attendance every week. There is now not just one church, but a network of Albanian churches called the Albanian Evangelical Alliance. Spanning not just Philadelphia, but New York, New Jersey, Chicago, and Toronto.

This past August has seen the beginning of two Bible studies. One for stay-at-home moms led by two faithful ladies. The other is held at different Albanian coffee shops. Albania's national holiday, called "Flag day" was celebrated in November, and September saw a restructuring of the Sunday School program and Sunday ESL.

Due to the loss of his job, it is now a crucial point for Martin to fundraise in order to help sustain the ministry, this includes both churches and private individuals coming together to support this outreach to the Albanian immigrants of Northeast Philadelphia. The goal of the church is to be self sustaining and able to contribute to other church plants and ministries in the next three years.

Prayer is of great value to the family and church as they meet with missions boards and as they continue the work of reaching out and evangelizing the Albanian community. Two weekly prayer meetings have begun, one Sunday night and one Wednesday night.

The Albanian community in America is quite large at 400,000 people nation-wide. Many of these are Muslims, which is why most major cities in the US have an Albanian Mosque.
