The past few weeks with our interns have been some of the richest we've experienced in Camden. We are so thankful for Jackie, Joy, Lindsey, Linnea, and Sarah, and are more than a little sad to see them go. Physically, we are very tired - we kept a busy schedule while they were here. But spiritually we feel powerfully refreshed. It's as if we've had a month of R&R as others came to take our place on the front lines of the battle to push back the darkness in Camden. They were incredibly creative, and made many cardboard signs, which tell the story of their time with us.

This was the name for the late-night event they ran at the end of their internship. They designed a tunnel where they confessed ways we as a church have failed to love people, and we set it up in St. Michael's along with a quiet prayer room and a painting area. We had another church - Glorious Undead - join us. They provided much needed prayer in a back room and also stood out front inviting people in. The plan is to run these events jointly with GU each month in the fall. There was also a sign that read Café because any good late-night event must have tea, coffee, and brownies. It was in the café that I reconnected with Obie, who had prayed with me at our last late-nighter but who I had not been able to meet with again since.

One last word about the interns, we are very conscious of our own weakness and inability to stand against the darkness in Camden on our own. The joy of the summer really comes out of a commitment to prayer - both on our part and on yours. Our team met with the interns each day for prayer, and we all fasted regularly to allow our bodies to engage in the weakness and desperation for God that we feel. Thank you to all of you who prayed for us and for our interns over the last month - these stories are the beginnings of the fruit of your prayers. Thanks for standing with us.
